Agriculture and Agri-Food 2013

The agriculture and agri-food sector is an important component of the provincial economy, generating employment, income and nourishment to both rural and urban communities. The sector combines approximately 2,611 farms and 140 processing plants to produce farm cash receipts of \$570 million and processed agri-food products worth over \$1 billion. New Brunswick enjoys one of the highest levels of value-added processing in the country from its agriculture and agri-food sector with around 80% of the province's agriculture production being processed in-province before reaching the market. The sector has an extensive network of export markets comprising over 70 countries, with total exports estimated at \$381 million in 2013. The sector is guite diverse with over 30 commodities being produced in New Brunswick. Potatoes, dairy products, poultry & eggs, floriculture, nursery & sod, fruits & berries, and beef accounted for close to 80% of total farm cash receipts in 2013. In terms of employment, the sector generated about 4,500 and 6,200 full-time equivalent jobs in primary production and secondary processing activities, respectively.







Exports of Agri-Food Products (\$ Millions)




2013 Highlights

- Potato receipts increased by about \$33 million (30%) to about \$144 million in 2013. This was mainly due to an increase in seeded area by 1,700 acres and marketable yield by 30 cwt for the 2012 crop compared to the 2011 crop. Although 2011 yield was low due to excess moisture problems, 2012 yield was close to the 10-year average (270 cwt/acre), an outcome which was reflected in 2013 due to the lag in reporting potato receipts.
- Grain receipts increased by more than \$2 million (10%) to slightly more than \$23 million in 2013. This was mainly due to an increase in soybean receipts by close to \$2 million as a result of a 60% increase in seeded acreage and a higher output price.
- Maple products receipts increased by nearly \$9 million (42%) from about \$20 million in 2012 to around \$29 million in 2013. This is mainly due to an increase in production by 136,000 gallons (39%) to 484,000 gallons in 2013.

- After record production in 2012, blueberry receipts were stable in 2013 at about \$31 million, as production and price remained consistent at around 43 million pounds and \$0.71 per pound, respectively.
- Hog receipts increased by about \$1 million (11%) from around \$11 million in 2012 to slightly more than \$12 million in 2013. This was mainly due to higher hog prices.
- Beef, eggs and dairy receipts increased by 4.3%, 1.8% and 0.7%, respectively, due to slightly higher prices compared to 2012.
- Agri-food export revenues decreased by close to \$40 million (9%) over 2012. This decrease is mainly due lower international exports of potato and potato product. It should be noted that the processed potato sector tends to supply its Canadian markets from New Brunswick and its export markets from its facilities in western Canada.
- Agri-food exports to Japan increased by about \$16 million in 2013 (more than double 2012 exports). Most of these exports were potato and potato products.
