We work to raise awareness in New Brunswick about human trafficking, both domestic and international.

We come from community groups, government departments and law enforcement around the province.

Since 2005, we have worked to inform ourselves about human trafficking and have taken actions to raise awareness within the community, especially among those who might come into contact with people being trafficked in New Brunswick.

We organize events, distribute publications, and give public presentations. We plan to develop a list of resources to help victims and interveners.

Human trafficking involves the recruitment, transportation, and/or harbouring of persons for the purpose of exploitation, typically into sexual exploitation or forced labour situations. Traffickers control their targets by using force or threats, or physical or emotional abuse.

Domestic human trafficking refers to trafficking people within Canada.

International human trafficking refers to people in Canada who were trafficked here from another country.
