## MINISTER'S DETERMINATION

CONDITIONS OF APPROVAL
Pursuant to Regulation 87-83 under the Clean Environment Act
April 14, 2014
File Number: 4561-3-1380

- 1. In accordance with section 6(6) of the Regulation, it has been determined that the undertaking may proceed following approval under all other applicable acts and regulations.
- 2. Commencement of this undertaking must occur within three years of the date of this Determination. Should commencement not be possible within this time period the undertaking must be registered under the *Environmental Impact Assessment Regulation* (87-83) <u>Clean Environment Act</u> again, unless otherwise stated by the Minister of Environment and Local Government (DELG).
- 3. The proponent shall adhere to all obligations, commitments, monitoring and mitigation measures presented in the document entitled, "Chip Handling and Continuous Cooking Digester Plant Renewal Environmental Impact Assessment Irving Pulp & Paper, Limited. Reversing Falls Mill, Saint John, New Brunswick, March 13, 2014", registered on March 13, 2014, as well as all those identified in subsequent correspondence during the registration review. Additionally, the proponent shall submit a summary table detailing the status of each Condition listed in this Determination to the Manager of the Environmental Assessment Section of the DELG every 6 months from the date of this Determination until such a time as all the Conditions have been met.
  - 4. If it is suspected that remains of archaeological significance are found during construction, operation or maintenance of the proposed development, as per the <u>Heritage Conservation Act</u> (2010), all activity shall be stopped near the find and the Resource Manager of the Archaeological Services Unit shall be contacted at (506) 453-3014.
  - 5. The proponent shall obtain an *Approval to Construct* from the Impact Management Branch, DELG, prior to the commencement of the project. For more information, please contact the Manager of the Industrial Processes Section at (506) 453-7945.
  - 6. An Environmental Protection Plan (EPP) must be prepared for the construction, operation, and maintenance phases of this project. The EPP must be submitted for review and must receive approval from the Manager of the Environmental Assessment Section of DELG prior to the commencement of any project activities. For more information, please contact the Manager at (506) 444-5382.
  - 7. The proponent shall ensure that periodic updates/meetings be coordinated with DELG Saint John Regional Staff, including the Approvals Engineer, regarding any public complaints, environmental concerns and overall project progress.
  - 8. Should public complaints about construction noise, dust concerns, lighting, or other nuisance aspects of the project occur, the project may be limited or stopped between the hours of 5-7PM, if a mitigation solution is not found.
  - 9. The proponent shall ensure that all developers, contractors and operators associated with the development project comply with the above requirements.
