

Distribution of total income

In this report, dollar figures are expressed in 2015 constant dollars and income refers to total income before taxes and deductions.

- The share of New Brunswick’s population with low income decreased between 2005 and 2015.
- Of those with income in 2015, just under half (48.6%) had total income under \$30,000, compared to 56.1% in 2005. Another quarter of the population in 2015 (25.1%) had total income between \$30,000 and \$49,999 and the remaining individuals (26.3%) had income over \$50,000.
- People with high income comprised a small proportion of the provincial population. Approximately 28,000 New Brunswickers reported total income of at least \$100,000, accounting for 4.6% of the population in 2015. This was up from 2.9% of the population in 2005.
- Nationally, 45.0% of Canadians had total income under \$30,000 in 2015, while 8.2% reported total income that exceeded \$100,000.
