SCOPE OF THE OCCUPATION

The heavy duty equipment technician occupation includes

(a) the interpreting and using of parts and service manuals;

(b) the repairing and servicing of gasoline and diesel engines, clutches, transmissions, axles, final drives, transfer cases, differentials, brakes, steering, suspensions and other allied assemblies;

(c) the testing and correcting of running gear alignment, including wheels, axles and track assemblies; and

(d) the servicing of fuel, electrical, hydraulic, air, cooling and lubrication systems.

The operations referred to in paragraphs (1)(a) to (d) apply to heavy equipment, such as off-highway trucks, tractors, dozers, rollers, graders, scrapers, loaders, shovels, compressors, cranes, hoists and pumps.
