FOREWORD

The annual graduate follow-up survey collects information from graduates of regular and non-regular community college training programs approximately one year following graduation. The information gathered provides valuable feedback on the success of graduates in the labour market and is an important tool for decision-makers. This tool, along with other sources, is incorporated into the college's planning process.

This report presents the findings of the 2021 Survey of 2020 Graduates of the New Brunswick Community College. The survey was conducted with 886 graduates over an 11-week period starting October 3, 2021. This represents a response rate of 48%.¹

The reference week for the survey was September 26 to October 2, 2021. Survey results indicate that survey respondents of the Class of 2020 were again successful in locating employment, with an employment rate of 90%.

The Department would like to thank the New Brunswick Community College graduates who participated in this survey; their input has been invaluable.

2021 Survey of 2020 Graduates of NBCC

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Executive Summary

This report presents the findings of the 2021 Survey of 2020 Graduates of the New Brunswick Community College. This follow-up survey generated information from 886 graduates, representing 48% of the 1,855 graduates to be contacted for this survey.²

The following bullet points present key information obtained through the 2021 survey:

- ▶ The employment rate in the 2021 reference week for graduates one year following graduation was 90%. The employment rate has remained relatively stable over time, and remains similar to what was reported in 2020 (91%).
- ► The employment rate in the reference week for female graduates was 91%, which is down from the female employment rate in 2020 (94%).
- ► The employment rate in the reference week for male graduates was 89%, which remains the same as the male employment rate in 2020 (89%).
- ► The unemployment rate in the reference week for graduates was 10% in 2021, up slightly but similar to what was reported in 2020 (9%).
- ▶ Overall, the percentage of graduates who worked in jobs related to their training during the reference week is down compared to the past year (76% in 2021, 82% in 2020).
- ▶ Among graduates with one or more months of employment since completing their training, 82% reported that at least some of their employment was related to their training, which is also down from the proportion in 2020 (90%).
- ► The percentage of employed graduates in the reference week working in New Brunswick dropped slightly over the past year (92% in 2021, 94% in 2020).
- ► The percentage of graduates who reported being solely self-employed in the reference week has remained relatively consistent over the past year (2% in 2021, 1% in 2020).
- ► The majority (88%) of employed graduates in 2021 worked for one employer in the reference week, although down slightly from what was reported in 2020 (90%).
- ▶ In the reference week, female graduates in full-time positions earned approximately 86% of the wages of the male graduates in full-time positions (\$815 versus \$944, respectively), which is lower than what was reported in 2020 (97%).

1.0 Introduction

Follow-up surveys with graduates of New Brunswick's community college system have been conducted since 1983. For the first 28 years, the survey was conducted by telephone; however, since 2011, an online survey has also been added. The survey is conducted annually with graduates of regular and non-regular programs of the colleges. In 2010, the governance structure of the community college system was converted from that of a Special Operating Agency (SOA) into two separate, autonomous Crown corporations: New Brunswick Community College (NBCC) and Collège communautaire du Nouveau-Brunswick (CCNB). The New Brunswick College of Craft and Design (NBCCD) retained its Special Operating Agency status within the Department of Post-Secondary Education, Training and Labour.

For the 2021 survey, interviews were completed with 886 graduates from a total listing of 1,855 graduates who were eligible to participate in the survey.³

The data supplied by these surveys provides valuable feedback on the success of New Brunswick Community College graduates in the labour market, which, in turn, serves as an important indicator of how well the training provided by NBCC corresponds to the demands of the labour market.

This report provides detailed information gathered from the 2021 Survey of 2020 Graduates of the New Brunswick Community College through five sections, summarized in the material that follows.

- ► Section 2.0 presents the methodology of the 2021 survey and provides a profile of the graduates contacted with a comparison with the overall population of graduates.
- ▶ **Section 3.0** presents the information highlights from the 2021 survey.
- ➤ **Section 4.0** presents fact sheets that summarize the survey information for some academic groups and specific programs.
- ▶ Section 5.0 presents labour market information for academic groups and specific programs.
- ➤ **Section 6.0** presents the evaluations provided by graduates of programs and services offered at NBCC.

A list of the terminology used in this report is provided in Appendix A.

2.0 Methodology

The 2021 Survey of 2020 Graduates of the New Brunswick Community College was guided by researchers from the Policy, Research and Labour Market Analysis Branch of the Department of Post-Secondary Education, Training and Labour (the Department). Any comments or questions about the information contained in this document should be forwarded to the Department.

In 2021, the New Brunswick Community College (NBCC) generated a database with background and current contact information for 1,867 graduates from the Class of 2020.⁴ The background data and required contact information was retrieved from the NBCC's student information management system.

During surveying, 12 graduates were removed from the original list⁵, leaving 1,855 eligible respondents. The 886 interviews completed represent 48% of the total number of graduates who were eligible to participate in this survey.

As in previous surveys, graduates were asked about their activities during a specific week of the year (the reference week). Reference week information is an indicator of graduates' current activities. *The reference week for the 2021 survey was September 26 to October 2, 2021*.

In addition to reference week information and information collected on activities since completing their training, graduates were also asked to evaluate their NBCC training program and various facilities and services available at their campus.

This survey was conducted by telephone and online using a Computer Assisted Telephone/Web Interviewing (CATI/CAWI) system. An attempt was made to contact all eligible graduates, regardless of their current area of residence.

All graduates with an email address were emailed a link to complete the survey online. In addition, all graduates with a cell phone number were sent a text with a link to the online survey. Approximately one week after the initial email and/or text, attempts were made to contact graduates by telephone to complete the survey by phone.

Over the course of surveying, six additional email reminders and two reminder texts were sent to individuals who had not yet completed the survey.

Graduates were assured of the absolute confidentiality of their responses and were informed of their valuable contribution to the study. A toll-free number and a survey-specific email address were provided to graduates if they had any questions or apprehensions about the survey. Graduates were given the option to complete the survey in French or English. Data for this study was collected from October 3, 2021 to December 20, 2021.

In total, 886 NBCC graduates completed the 2021 survey. Of those completed surveys, 512 (58%) completed online and 374 (42%) completed by telephone. The 2021 survey response rate of 48% is higher than that of the previous year (43%).

These 12 graduates were removed from the list because they indicated they were not graduates of 2020.




The survey typically includes graduates of regular and some non-regular (or contract) training programs of approximately 12 weeks or longer. The population for this year's survey consisted of those who graduated during the 2020 calendar year and who provided their consent for use of their contact information.

Figure 1 presents an overview of the age and gender distribution for graduates contacted.⁷ The largest group of respondents was males aged 24 years or younger, followed by females in the same age group.



The file of eligible graduates for 2016 did not contain any non-regular (contract) graduates.



Respondents who did not provide a response were excluded.

Table 2 presents a comparative summary of the graduate population over the past five years. The percentage of female graduates in 2021 (47%) remains relatively consistent compared to last year (48% in 2020), although is at its lowest proportion over the past five years. The percentage of graduates 24 years of age and younger also remains consistent with the past year (45% in 2021, 44% in 2020) after decreasing each of the past four years.

3.0 Survey Highlights

The information in this section presents a summary of research findings for the Class of 2020, along with a comparison of key variables in relation to research findings from previous years.

3.1 Labour Force Information (Reference Week)

The labour force participation rate for all graduates in the reference week remains unchanged (93% in both 2021 and 2020). The female participation rate increased slightly from 91% in 2020 to 93% in 2021, while the participation rate for males remained fairly similar compared to the previous year (93% in 2021, 94% in 2020).

Table 4 presents comparative labour market information for the 2021 survey and the population of New Brunswick. As shown, graduates had a similar unemployment rate (10%) compared with the province as a whole (9%). However, the unemployment rate for graduates was lower than the youth unemployment rate of 15% (unadjusted) for November 2021.

Table 5 summarizes employment rates from 2017–2021 overall and by gender. Overall, the employment rate has remained relatively stable over time, ranging from 89% to 91% over the past five years (90% in 2021, 91% in 2020). The employment rate for female graduates dropped slightly from the past year (94% to 91%) but the employment rate for male graduates was unchanged (89% in both 2020 and 2021).

As shown in Table 6, the majority of employed graduates continue to be employed in New Brunswick, with the proportion showing a slight drop from the previous year (92% in 2021 and 94% in 2020).

3.2 Additional Education / Training for Graduates

As demonstrated in Table 7, the percentage of graduates attending or planning to attend an educational institution or training program within the next four months decreased from 2020 (14% in 2021, 18% in 2020).

3.3 Overall Employment for Graduates

Since graduation, 97% of graduates have been employed in at least one job of one month or longer in duration. The following table demonstrates the percentage of those employed graduates with at least one month of that employment in a position related to their training.

Among those graduates with one or more months of employment since completing their training (97%, n = 851), 82% reported that at least some of their employment was related to their training. On average, 73% of the total months worked since graduation were in positions related to their training. ¹⁶

3.4 Geographic Location of Graduates

At the time of the survey, 92% of graduates who responded were residing in New Brunswick, which is down slightly from the previous class of graduates (94% in 2020).¹⁸

Approximately 11% of graduates had lived outside New Brunswick since graduation. Among those who had lived outside the province (n = 95), the majority (59%) left the province for employment, which is lower than in 2020 (64%). In 2021, 57% of graduates who left the province for employment had obtained employment prior to relocation, which is higher than the previous year (50% in 2020).

As with previous years, the majority of employed graduates (57%) were employed in the reference week in positions directly related to their training, although this proportion is down compared to the previous year (67% in 2020), as well as related employment overall (directly and indirectly) (76% in 2021 and 82% in 2020).

In the 2021 survey, there were only 24 respondents among the list of eligible graduates who had graduated from a co-op program in 2020, so results should be examined with caution. All of those respondents were part of the labour force and 23 were employed. All of those employed reported being employed in a position either directly or indirectly related to their training during the reference week.

The percentage of employed graduates in full-time positions in the reference week has remained relatively stable over the past five years (93% in 2021, 90–93% between 2017 and 2020). The proportion of female graduates with full-time employment is up compared to the previous year (90% in 2021; 87% in 2020).

Graduates working full-time averaged 41 hours in the reference week, with an average weekly wage of \$888. Graduates working part-time averaged 17 hours with an average weekly wage of \$430.²⁹

Gender differences in wages

In past graduate surveys, significant gaps have been identified between the overall wages of male and female graduates. In the 2021 reference week, male graduates averaged \$944 per week in full-time positions, while female graduates in full-time positions averaged \$815 per week, a gap of -14%. This compares to a gap of -3% reported in 2020, with male graduates earning \$826 per week and female graduates earning \$799 per week.⁴¹

The table below demonstrates 10 occupations in which at least two female and two male respondents reported their full-time weekly earnings during the reference week. The biggest wage differences are shown with *human resources professionals* (females reporting 49% higher wages than males) and *insurance agents and brokers* (females reporting 38% lower wages than males). It should be noted that these results should be interpreted with caution due to very small sample sizes.

Not working (unemployed and not in the labour force)

Out of all graduates, 17% (n = 150) were not working during the reference week. This includes those who were classified as unemployed (n = 81) and those who were not in the labour force (n = 60). Graduates who were not working during the reference week were asked to provide the main reason that they were not working.

Most commonly, graduates were not working during the reference week because they indicated they were *in school full-time* (27%), there were *no jobs available* (12%), or they were *unable to find a job related to their NBCC training* (11%).

Although only 2% of respondents mentioned COVID-19 as the main reason they were not working during the reference week, when asked specifically, 32% of respondents not working during the reference week (n = 43) reported that the main reason they were not working was related to the pandemic, which is down from 42% the previous year. 45%

Twenty-nine percent (29%) of graduates not working during the reference week (n = 42) were attending or planning to attend an educational institution or training program, 98% of whom (n = 41) are attending or planning to attend full-time. These respondents are attending or planning to attend a *university* (44%), *community college* (37%), or *private training institution* (18%).

Following are the top reasons these graduates provided for their return to an educational institution or training program:

- To upgrade existing skills (26%)
- To learn a new trade or occupation (24%)
- To obtain a university degree (19%)
- To get a better/more interesting job (17%)



3.6 Other Survey Findings

Employment since graduation

Nearly all graduates (97%) have been employed for a period of at least one month since graduation.⁴⁷ Those who have been employed averaged 1.7 different jobs. The percentage of graduates who have been employed since graduation is comparable to the past year (98% for the previous class of graduates).

Prior Learning Assessment and Recognition (PLAR) and Credit Transfer Services

Graduates were asked questions to determine their awareness, use, and evaluation of PLAR and Credit Transfer Services. Overall:

- 64% of graduates reported that they were aware of these services; and
- 36% were not aware of these services.⁴⁸

Among those who were aware of these services (n = 524):

- 62% heard about PLAR through their college campus;
- 30% heard about PLAR through word of mouth;
- 10% heard about PLAR through their instructors/teachers/director;
- 5% heard about PLAR through the internet/NBCC website;
- 4% heard about PLAR through their high school;
- 2% heard about PLAR through other students;
- 1% heard about PLAR through an information session/orientation;
- 1% knew about PLAR through past experience;
- 1% heard about PLAR through the newspaper; and
- 1% heard about PLAR though another method.⁴⁹

Of graduates who were aware of these services, 25% (n = 127) have used them (14% of all graduates).⁵⁰

Of those who have used these services:

- 76% have applied for Credit Transfer;
- 13% have applied for a Prior Learning Assessment; and
- 11% have applied for both.⁵¹

Graduates who have applied for one or both of these services were asked if they had received course credit for courses taken at another institution or from an employer. The majority of these graduates (94%) reported that they had received course credit.⁵² This course credit resulted in a *reduced course load* for 85%, *reduced tuition* for 7%, and *reduced time to graduate* for 3%, while 11% percent of graduates reported their progress *did not change* due to receiving course credit.⁵³

The graduates who received course credit (n = 122) provided the following evaluations of the services they received:

- 52% were very satisfied;
- 43% were satisfied;
- 2% were unsatisfied; and
- 2% were very unsatisfied.

Terminology

NBCC

New Brunswick Community College is a corporation including six campuses situated throughout the province of New Brunswick.

Average Weekly Earnings

Refers to the average of the gross earnings that graduates reported for the reference week. The information presented in the fact sheets are based on earnings reported by graduates who indicated that their employment was either *directly or indirectly* related to their training.

Employed

The number of respondents who had a job during the reference week.

Employment

Defined in terms of full-time/part-time and permanent/temporary as follows:

Full-time: Employment of 30 hours or more per week.
Part-time: Employment of less than 30 hours per week.

Permanent: Employment which has no prearranged termination date.

Temporary: Employment which ends at a prearranged date.

Employment Rate

The number of employed graduates as a percentage of those in the labour force.

Employment Related to Training

Employed graduates were asked about the extent to which their employment during the reference week was related to their training program. Options presented to the respondent included directly related, indirectly related and not at all related.

<u>Related Employment</u> – includes employment that graduates reported as either directly related or indirectly related to their training program.

Not at all related – means that were in jobs that were not at all related to their training.

Graduate Population

Graduates of regular training programs or non-regular (contract or distance) training programs of twelve weeks or more in duration that terminated between January 1, and December 31, 2020.

Labour Force

In the context of this survey, Labour Force is composed of respondents who were either employed or unemployed but looking for work during the reference week.

Not in the Labour Force

Respondents who were not working and not looking for work, during the reference week.

Labour Force Participation Rate

The percentage of respondents who were actively participating in the labour force during the reference week (based on the total number of respondents).

Labour Force Survey

A monthly survey by Statistics Canada which collects labour force information from a representative sample of the working age population.

NAICS (North American Industrial Classification System) 2017

NAICS was used to categorize the industrial sectors/industries in which graduates were employed in the reference week. Fact sheets list the top industries for employment.

NOC (National Occupational Classification) 2016

The National Occupational Classification was used to categorize the kind of work done by graduates. The top responses are given.

Programs

<u>Regular</u> – programs that operated throughout the year on a year-to-year basis. Regular training programs are listed in the annual NBCC Calendar.

<u>Non-Regular</u> – programs that are offered through NBCC that are not part of the regular program listing in the Calendar. These programs may or may not have the same content as regular training programs of the same name.

<u>Co-op</u> – cooperative Education Programs integrate periods of classroom study with periods of training in related work. Each work situation is developed and approved by the College as a suitable learning situation. Co-op trainees are placed in productive work, receive wages and have their progress monitored by the employers and representatives of the College.

Reference Week

The week of September 26 to October 2, 2021 served as the reference week for this survey. During the survey all graduates were asked about their activities during this week.

Response Rate

The number of respondents as a percentage of the number of eligible graduates.

Self Employed

Someone who is working but has no employer other than her/himself.

Total Employment since Graduation

The total number of graduates who reported that they had been employed, at some time, since completing their training at NBCC.

Relation of Employment since Graduation to Training

The percentage of graduates who reported that they held at least one employment position since graduation which was either directly or indirectly related to their training program at NBCC.
