EVERYONE PAYS FOR INTIMATE PARTNER VIOLENCE (IPV)

IPV COSTS **\$7.4 BILLION** EACH YEAR IN CANADA

\$6 BILLION

IN VICTIM COSTS

Victims seeking medical attention, lost wages, damaged or destroyed property and the intangibles of pain and suffering and loss of life.

\$545 MILLION

IN CRIMINAL AND CIVIL JUSTICE SYSTEM COSTS

Police, court, prosecution, legal aid, corrections, civil protection orders, divorce and separation, and child protection systems.

\$890 MILLION

THIRD PARTY COSTS

Losses to employers, the negative impact on children exposed to violence and other government expenditures.
