## Investment in Affordable Housing 2011-14 Annual Report on Outcomes, 2015-16

In 2011, the Governments of Canada and New Brunswick announced a combined investment of \$46.8 million under a new affordable housing agreement. Over three years, this joint initiative helped build and repair 5,192 affordable housing units in New Brunswick for low-income individuals, families, seniors and persons with disabilities.

Under the terms of the agreement, New Brunswick Housing Corporation will publicly report, annually, on how funding has been spent and how progress has been achieved in meeting the objectives outlined within the agreement.

The following are outcomes from the three years of the program, which saw a total of approximately \$47.81 million in funding committed throughout the province.
